

THE 2026 MANDATORY TRIAD

If you haven't audited these three since the March 2025 deadline, your compliance is at risk.



Multi-Factor Everywhere:

Mandatory MFA for every access attempt into the Cardholder Data Environment (CDE).



The 12-Character Rule:

All system passwords must meet the new 12-character minimum as the 8-character policies will now trigger a non-compliance finding.



E-commerce Script Integrity:

You must have an automated mechanism to detect and alert on unauthorized changes to payment page scripts and HTTP headers.

CONTINUOUS MONITORING (The Pulse)

The PCI v4.0.1 standard prioritizes "Business-as-Usual" (BAU) security.



Daily

Automated log reviews and alert triaging (Requirement 10.4.1).



Weekly

Change-detection monitoring for all payment-related web pages.



Quarterly

ASV (Approved Scanning Vendor) external scans and internal vulnerability assessments.

THE 2026 CALENDAR: MAY - DECEMBER

Q2

Current Phase:
Verification

Firewall Integrity: Conduct your bi-annual review of firewall and router rule sets to eliminate security gaps.

Third-Party Check: Verify that your service providers have provided their 2026 Attestation of Compliance (AOC).

Q3

The Deep Dive:
Testing

Penetration Testing: Launch your annual internal and external penetration tests. Ensure they include testing of segmentation controls.

Targeted Risk Analysis (TRA): Update your TRA for any controls where you have adopted the "Customized Approach."

Q4

The Final Mile:
Audit

Evidence Gathering: Audit your logs from Q1-Q3. v4.0.1 auditors require proof of consistent frequency, not just a snapshot.

Incident Response: Conduct a tabletop exercise focusing on account data compromise and skimming detection.

AMPCUS INSIGHT: THE "EVIDENCE GAP"

In 2026, the most common audit failure isn't a lack of tools, it's a lack of logs. If you cannot prove your daily log reviews happened in April, you cannot "re-verify" them in December. Ensure your automation is capturing every compliance milestone in real-time.
